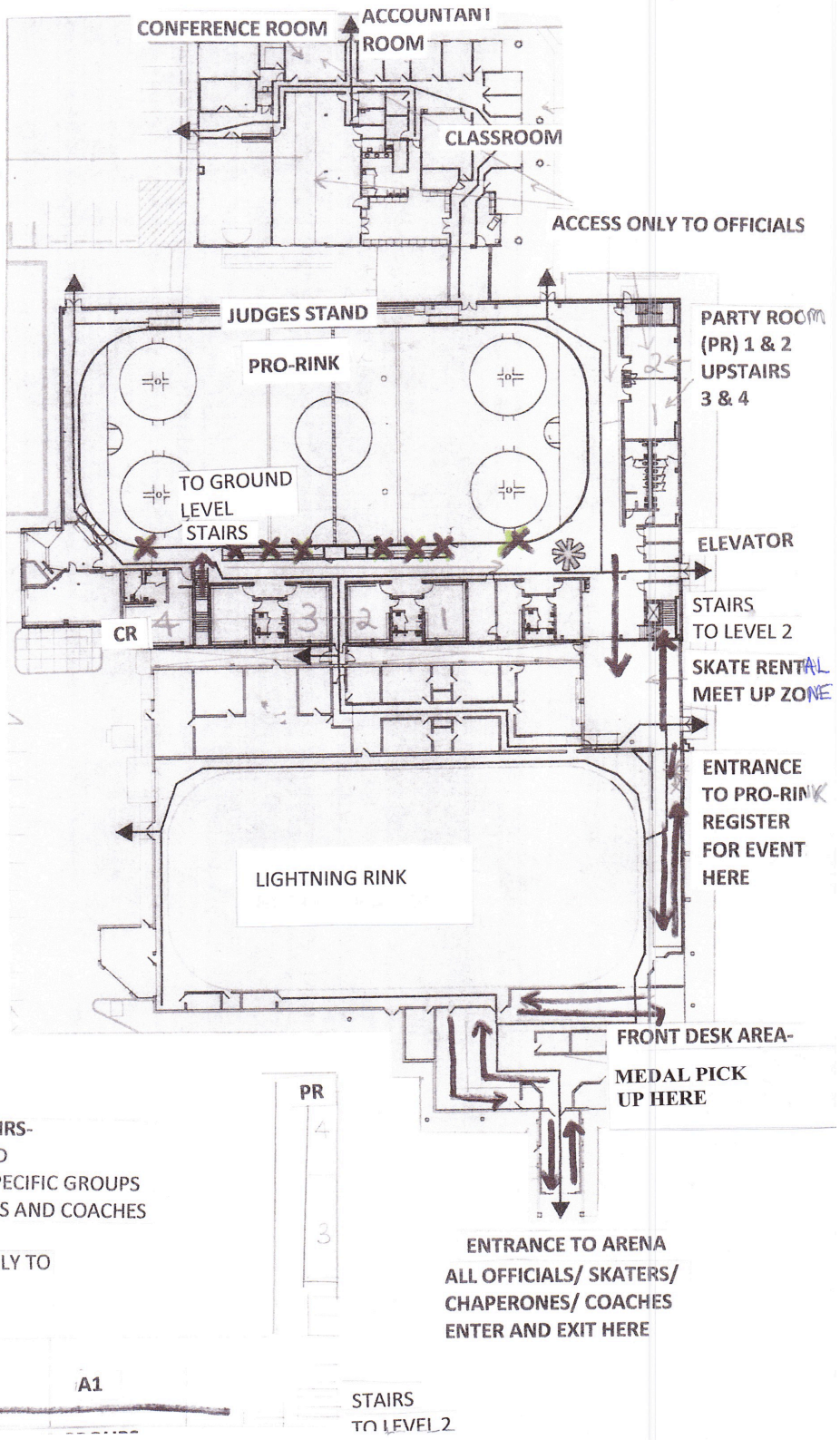


STAIRS

EVENT FLOW: COACHES (follow **black** arrows)

- Masks must be worn at all times inside the facility by everyone over the age of 2 years.
- Hospitality for coaches will not be available. Hospitality items can be bought at the snack bar adjacent to front desk. It has limited seating
- Coaches should not stay in the arena in between events, unless they have another skater competing
- Coaches will receive credentials at the registration area, located at the entrance to the Pro-rink
- Ushers will escort each designated group of skaters upstairs to the areas (A1 and A2) designated for off-ice warm up. Coaches can accompany the group of skaters, unless Coach already has skaters on the ice
- 20 minutes is allocated for off-Ice warmup. 15 mins is allocated for skaters to put on their skates. When one group of skaters enters and exits the ice, via 2 gates, clearly marked, the Usher will take the next group of skaters with their coaches down the far end stairs and direct them to designated seating rink-side to put on their skates. Or they may meet their coach rink side if the coach already has a skater on the ice.
- Remote coaching is permitted via a communication device- A coach may communicate with a skater during practice ice and during an event as long as all SafeSport criteria and competition policies are met including:
 - a) The skater's personal phone may not be used for communications
 - b) The phone may not be brought on the ice, or propped up so that it could fall on the ice
 - c) Two deep leadership must be adhered to while the communications are taking place. Event volunteers will not be able to fulfill the role
 - d) Parents and other skaters are not allowed rink side during practice ice or competition events. Two deep leadership for such times would need to be fulfilled by another credentialed PSA compliant coach with appropriate access
 - e) There are no exceptions to these policies, and violations may be reported to PSA and SafeSport
- Results will be posted online approximately 45 minutes after the event is complete
- Medals are awarded 1 hour after the event is complete
- The coach is free to move around from place to place to check on their skaters but please adhere to the specified pathways to follow
- Skaters and coaches are NOT permitted to stay/sit in the Area 3 seating upstairs, which is only designated for Chaperones who have skaters warming up and performing at the time

Awards

- Results will be posted online approximately 45 minutes after the event is complete
- Medals are awarded 1 hour after the event is complete. Medals can be picked up at the front desk area.
- Medals will be presented to 1st-4th finishers in Compete USA events. Medals will be awarded to 1st-3rd finishers in all other events.
- Competitors and chaperones must leave the facility until online results are live and may only return to collect medals at the scheduled awards times
- There will be a medal podium stationed outside to allow for photographs. Skaters are expected to stand 6ft apart on the podium
- Skaters will be allowed to remove their masks for the photo only, if they wish

Practice Ice Flow

- Skaters, coaches and chaperones (2 chaperones, per skater), must enter through main entrance to facility. Upon entering the rink area (Clearwater Ice Arena) there will be a large sign asking if the person entering has had any of the symptoms of Covid-19 or exposure to anyone who has tested positive for Covid-19. By entering the rink area, that person will be certifying that they have not.
- Skaters and Coaches should arrive and check-in for Practice ice at the Registration area at the entrance to the Pro-rink, no earlier than 20 minutes prior to the start time of their session
- Skaters are encouraged to sign up for practice ice on EMS (Practice ice will be open for purchase beginning on 20 June until 2 July. All Skaters can indicate number of sessions they want and pay for them when they register on-line at a cost of \$20 per 20 mins. Additional practice ice will be available for purchase during the competition at a cost of \$25 per 20 mins at the Registration Desk. Practice ice fees are non-refundable
- Upstairs off-ice warm up areas (Area 1 @2) will be available before skater's practice session
- No more than 12 skaters will be allowed on the Practice Ice in a single session
- Each skater may have 1 coach and 1 chaperone with them during practice ice
- An Usher will escort the skaters and coaches for one practice session time as a group to the rink-side. Another Usher will escort the chaperones to the Upstairs seating in Areas (A)1, 2 and 3 zones.
- Chaperones, Coaches and Skaters must exit the building promptly when their practice session is finished, unless the skater is on the next session
- One-way paths will be clearly marked and Ushers will provide directions to ensure the safest space for all skaters, coaches and chaperones. Please keep social distancing in mind at all times.
- Changing rooms will NOT be available during Practice Ice times and throughout the Competition. Skaters are encouraged to be dressed for Practice ice
- Skating Order for Official Music will be listed online and at ice entrance. Official music will be played only on your assigned official session. No additional music will be played
- Coaches will be directed by their usher to the gate/ hockey box locations to ensure social distancing. If you are coaching on consecutive Practice Ice Sessions, please notify your Usher
- The Usher will direct the skaters to the doors they will use to enter/ exit the ice

Disinfecting Process

- Chairs and areas that have been touched by the skaters/coaches and chaperones will be scheduled for disinfection throughout the day during Practice and Competition time
- Officials staging area will be disinfected at scheduled times throughout the day,

Covid-19 Considerations

- An individual must not be exposed to known positive covid-19 individuals without proper droplet plus universal precautions (glove, gown, mask, shield)
- An individual must not have a cluster of the CDC signs/ symptoms of Covid-19
- Masks are required to be worn while in the arena regardless of local and state regulation. There will not be any exceptions. Coaches, skaters, chaperones or officials who do not adhere to these guidelines will not be allowed into the arena and be asked to leave
- However, competitors may take off their masks when they are on the ice. The competitor may place their mask in a single plastic bag, found at the entrance to the ice, and give it to their coach. When the competitor exits the ice, the bag will be handed back to the skater
- Social distancing of all persons in the facility is encouraged and to be demonstrated at registration tables, hospitality tables, official panel staging stand, designated ready areas that are clearly marked for individual skaters, and designated coaching gates and boxes
- Easy access hand sanitizer and handwipes will be available throughout facility
- Chairs and areas that have been touched by the skaters/coaches/ chaperones will have scheduled disinfection times
- Officials staging area will also be disinfected at scheduled times throughout the day
